


Lodging at Camp Nakanawa Crossville, TN

#### Travel from Charlottesville




6 hr. and 53 min. from Charlottesville By way of Interstate Highways I-64, I-81 and I-40


### Eclipse Track

#### Camp Background

- Camp Nakanawa is a Girls Camp established in 1920. The season runs mid- June through the end of July
- Located on 1,000 acres on the Cumberland Plateau,
   13 miles west of Crossville, TN and just south of I-40
- Camp centers on a lake and has a variety of trails, courts and activities
- The camp has hosted astronomy events and star parties in the past
- My wife has been associated with the camp for more than 50 years as camper and counselor and my daughter is Junior Camp Director in 2016

#### Weather Statistics

- The weather for the area on August 21 for the last 10 years has been
- Low 64°F (18°C)
- High 84°F (29°C)
- Dew Point ranges between 56°F and 68°F (13°C)
   and 20°C)
- Sky conditions at approximately 1:30 pm 4/9 clear and 5/9 partly cloudy

# Details for Summer 2017 Eclipse Event

- We can check in on Saturday, August 19<sup>th</sup> and check out Tuesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup>
- There is no minimum number of participants required
- The cost is \$50 per night per person. This includes 3 meals. If we decided to do a brunch and dinner the cost would be \$45.
- There are a variety of accommodations available including bunk houses and small cabins

#### Details Continued

- There are male and female bathhouses for restroom and showers
- Camping may be available but cost would be the same
- Dogs must be on a leash at all times and cleaned up after
- We would be required to have a Red Cross certified lifeguard if using the lake
- Meals would be served at a set time in the dining hall and they would work with us on a menu

#### **Details Continued**

- We would need to bring bed linens or could sleep on bunks using sleeping bags
- We would be required to do basic cleanup when leaving (sweeping cabin and taking trash to dumpster)
- The Camp is a smoke-free area
- Alcoholic beverages are allowed in moderation
- No hair dryers or high wattage appliances
- Campfires only in approved areas

#### What's Next

- They would like a preliminary number from our club by the end of March so that they can determine if there is room to open this up for any other interested astronomy clubs
- Final payment would be due July 1, 2017
