

#### **ABOUT THE SPEAKER**

**James Mullaney** is an astronomy lecturer and author who has published nearly 1,000 articles and 9 books\* on observing the wonders of the heavens, and logged over 20,000 hours of stargazing time with the unaided eye, binoculars and telescopes. Formerly Curator of the Buhl Planetarium in Pittsburgh and Director of the DuPont Planetarium at USCA, he served as staff astronomer at the University of Pittsburgh's Allegheny Observatory and as an editor for *Sky & Telescope* magazine. One of the contributors to Carl Sagan's original award-winning *Cosmos* PBS-Television series, his lifelong mission has been to get others to look up at the majesty of the night sky and personally experience the joys of stargazing. It's estimated that more than a million people of all ages, faiths and backgrounds have heard his inspiring message. In recognition of his work he has been elected a Fellow of the prestigious Royal Astronomical Society of London.

His latest book, *Celebrating the Universe!* subtitled the *Spirituality & Science of Stargazing*, has been published by Hay House.
